Unable to present any identification?

In the Polling Station your identity and residency MAY BE VOUCHED FOR by an elector whose name appears on the List of Electors in a

polling division in the same electoral district, has provided acceptable identification and takes an oath.

If you are not on the list and lack sufficient identification you may VOTE BY PERSONAL ACQUAINTANCE in the office

of the Returning Officer or at an Advanced Poll in a community without a Returning Officer.
